What is CSS/Why CSS?

- A language complementary to HTML
- Separation of structure (HTML) and style (CSS)
- Centralisation of style in one file
 - modifying one declaration can affect the whole site
- Allows allocating style to HTML elements defined by complex relationships
 - e.g. A list in a list
- Note: Like HTML, different browsers interpret CSS differently
